Discovery Tour!

Explore the electrically lit portion of the Cave of the Winds on a 45 – 60 minute guided walking tour which includes 15 rooms, a 1/2 mile of concrete walkways, and 196 stairs. On this tour you will learn about the history and geology of the cave while being shown some of its most beautiful formations. The cave is consistently 54 degrees fahrenheit, so a light sweater or jacket may be necessary. Wear comfortable clothing, such as a long sleeve shirt and pants, and good walking shoes.

Caving 101

Take An Exciting Cave Trek! Explore the wild, undeveloped depths of the Manitou Grand Caverns on the 2 – 2.5-hour guided tour that involves an assortment of crawling, climbing, and walking through wet and muddy passages of various sizes. On this tour, you will crawl / climb / walk for nearly a mile while learning basic spelunking skills and the history as well as geology of the cave. This tour is not recommended for guests who have back or knee trouble. Please wear clothing you won't mind getting dirty and possibly ruined by the mud in the cave. Each participant needs to bring a flashlight or headlamp, a change of clothes, and an extra pair of shoes. Knee pads and/or a pair of gloves may be helpful. There will be no other source of light in the portion of the cave you will be exploring.
